Textual teacher-submitted lesson plans categorized by core subject for k-5 or 6-8. This collection is not current, but the computer lesson is about the only unusable one. Each subject level has a numbered list of titles with specific grade level. Although there is no topic subdivision, the lists are easy to scan. All lesson plans are located on the site so there are no dead ends.

Select lesson plans for K-8 classroom activities from an alphabetical list of topics or enter a keyword search. The resulting annotated list gives the targeted grade level(s). Each activity includes objectives, materials, and procedure; no assessment or standards alignment. Permission to copy for classroom use.

Search for lessons and units that integrate technology into the curriculum. Can limit to primary or intermediate. All lessons have been submitted to a teacher-panel for review before listing. This section of the Apple site is no longer being maintained as an active site with new ratings and submissions, but the units are valid. The copyright states, "All Rights Reserved."

Select from a list of subjects and/or specify K-5 or 6-8. Primarily science and social studies topics. Lesson plans are generally quite complete including assessment, standards alignment, and online resources. Provides a pdf version of each lesson plan as well. The broad green heading and its buttons are for the DiscoverySchool site and not this Lesson Plans section of that site. All rights reserved.

Well organized set of over 2500 lesson plans, primarily elementary. Keyword searchable or browse by selecting first by subject area then by level PreK-1, 2-3, 4-5, 6-7, or junior/high. Lesson plans include assessment, standards alignment, and Web resources. Each lesson has a button for a print friendly version that opens in a second window. The site includes a section of lesson plans appropriate for specific holidays and seasonal events.
